Ash Wednesday Services February 26, 2020

Ash Wednesday at Zion this year will mark the day with imposition of ashes at two services. The first service will be at 12:00 noon and will be a 15 minute service of confession and imposition of ashes. This service will be for everyone but especially for those who find it difficult to come out at night this time of year, or who want to begin Lent with receiving ashes but can't attend the evening service. The second service will be the traditional service with the reading of Psalm 51, scripture readings, sermon, confession and imposition of ashes. This service will begin at 6:30 p.m. Everyone is welcomed and encouraged to come as the church begins the 40 days of Lent.

Lenten Study of the Passion of Christ according to Mark

This Lent we will study the Passion of our Lord in the Gospel of Mark. Each Wednesday in Lent beginning on March 4, at 6:30 p.m. we will gather in Augustana Hall to study the last days of Jesus, beginning with the last supper and ending with the crucifixion. You will be provided with the text each week. We will also begin with a hymn and a prayer as we come together to learn about the last days of Jesus.

Indulge for Lent?

Rather than sacrificing something for Lent — especially something easy and spiritually insignificant, such as chocolate — Patty Kirk, in *Guideposts* magazine, suggests finding new ways to indulge in God's presence. Surely one can do this by having extra devotions or attending Lenten worship services. But Kirk offers these ideas:

- Spend time outdoors, sensing God's magnificence.
- Spend time with others, extending generosity and compassion. Remember Jesus' promise that when you care for others, you care for him (Matthew 25:31-46).
- Pray for the "little things," coming before God in childlike trust and feeling peace.
- Watch attentively for God's answers to prayer, and receive them as reminders of his presence.
- Turn anxiety into prayer. As you frame concerns as prayers and entrust them to God, you "sacrifice" the tendency to wallow in worry.
